Year 6 The children have been looking at dividing decimal numbers by 1 and 2 digit whole numbers. Next week the children will be completing the Maths SATs paper from last year to look at progress so far and the areas we would like to work on before May.
Other subjects	Next week in science the children will be writing a formal report on the Exe Estuary explaining the different types of habitats found and the adaptations of creatures living within them.
