Thank you for coming and supporting us at sports day, both the children and the adults had a wonderful time. Well done for sticking it out through the drizzle!

This week the children have been learning how to write instructions. They made recycled newspaper flowerpots. Their instructions had to be very specific or the pots would fall apart. They then recorded themselves reading their instructions in a YouTube style instructional video. They really enjoyed this, maybe they could show you how to make one this weekend?

In Maths we have been practising our subtraction skills. Year 1 have been making links between number bonds to 10 and 20. So if they know that 10-8=2 they now know that 20-8=12. This is a key skill and will help them greatly in Year 2. Year 2 have been practising taking a 2 digit number away from a 2 digit number. This is a hard challenge and the children have been very resilient.

English - Please read some factual books about trees, what features do these books have? Do they have titles, captions, subheadings etc? Can you research some tree facts?

Maths - Both Year 1's and 2's need to be able to quickly recall all number facts up to 20 by the end of the year e.g 7+5, 12+3, 18-4 etc. Please continue to practise this, you may want to record them on a poster, play a quickfire adding game or make them into a song.

Spellings - Please remember that your child may not be with their class teacher for phonics.

Miss Doe – This week we have been practising adding the suffix 'ly' please use the rules you've practised to add 'ly' to the following words; quick, hopeless, proud, steady, gready, crazy, sincere, extreme, wise, formal, social, general, faithful, peaceful, successful.

Mrs Pickering/Miss Hawkes - Please practise spelling the days of the week and the months of the year.

Miss Bailey - This week we have been looking at how the suffix 'ed' changes a word e.g. look to looked. We have found it very challenging to spell 'ed' words correctly rather than writing 'id' or 't'. Please can you use the table on the back of the sheet to sort 'ed' words by the sound the 'ed' makes.
