Library books



The children have visited the school library and have brought a book home to share with you. You may like to read this book to your child or your child may like to make up stories from the pictures. Every Thursday, your child will need to bring their school library book and Home Learning book back to enable us to provide vou with a new book and news.

Wow Moments

We love hearing the children's news from home about what they can do. This week we have provided you with some 'WOW' post it notes. Over the coming weeks, if your child does something new and they would like to share their news with the class please write it down on the post it and bring it in. It might be ... your child has learnt to do their zip up on their coat, your child has eaten peas for the first time, your child has helped tidy away the table etc..

Dora the Communicating Dolphin

Dora the Communicating Dolphin is a cuddly dolphin toy that will be sent home each week with one of the children. Over the weekend, we would like your child to share their experiences with Dora, so during the week they are able to share with the class the adventures Dora went on (Dora needs to be returned by Tuesday at the latest). Dora may



- stay in and play with lego/the doll house/read a book
- have gone to see a family member
- have gone shopping or on a car journey etc.

Dora will be accompanied with a book, where you might like to sit down with your child and write about what Dora did with you or your child might like to draw a picture. This will support your child when sharing with the class what they did together. We hope you have fun with Dora and we cannot wait to hear what she gets up to.

Independence

As soon as your child starts school, we encourage independence. We would be grateful if you could support this by:

- Laying out their school clothes and encouraging them to try to get dressed.
- Allow your child to carry their own book bag to school.
- Encourage your child to put on their own coat and be able to do it up using either zips or buttons.

Just a few reminders

The area outside the classroom doors is set up in the morning ready for the children to do 'Thinking and Doing'. Please can you ensure that your child does not touch any of the equipment when they arrive in the morning. They will get plenty of time to explore this area throughout the day.

Many of the children are bringing in big backpacks. These are not necessary as the children have bookbags that they can fit their belongings inside. Their drinks and snack pots are kept inside the classroom all day and they have pegs to store their coats and PE bags on.

Have you provided your child with;	✓		
Wellington boots (labelled with your child's name)			
Book bag (Please attach a key ring to the handle or display your childs name on the front so that they can recognise it)			
Water bottle and fruit snack labelled with your childs name— due to allergies this needs to be a piece of fruit or veg (no cheese, sandwiches, chocolate or cereal bars)			
Spare pants and clothing in bookbags (in case of untimely accidents)			
A waterproof coat because we go out in all weathers.
