

Year 3 Autumn 2 Home Learning Tasks

This term we will be learning about 'Mountains' in Geography, 'More Hindu Stories' in RE and the 'Cradles of Civilisation' in History. We will also be looking at animals including humans in Science. Our English will firstly look at non-fiction information books and then focus on imaginative story writing. With our Maths we will be looking at further adding and subtracting three-digit numbers. It would really help if the children practised their 4 and 8 times tables on TTRockstars a few times a week at home.

Each week you can choose one or two activities from the grid below. This part of your home learning should take no longer than 1 hour. Please continue to practise your times tables and spellings each week and enjoy plenty of reading!

Use an atlas to find a map of the world. Can you spot the mountain ranges? What are they called? Where are they?	Write a food diary of the food you have eaten during the week. What nutrition did you get from it?	Use your imagination to create a story involving the main character discovering a new enchanted location. What happens there? What does it look like? Who do they meet?	Write some of the facts you have learnt in RE (about Hindu stories).
Design a PowerPoint about how you are different to a member of your family.	Choose a three-digit and two-digit number from a set of cards (0-10). Make up a subtraction number story then work out the problem using the column method. Did you need to regroup/rename? Show how you did this in your working.	Have a go at helping Jack, Sam and Jo on their mission to tidy up the planet in this game called 'Junkateers'. Type in google - Junkateers bitesize bbc game	Create an imaginary place using some lego or toys. Can you describe what you have made? Who lives there? What are they called? What job do they do? Anything else?
Thesaurus skills: Learn a new word a day! In the lead up to Christmas, why not use a Thesaurus to build your vocabulary? Write a list of words you would like to make better - for example, 'big' can be replaced with 'enormous' or 'gigantic'. Make a list of these in your home learning book and try to use them in everyday conversations!	Draw arrays and groups to help you understand the 3, 4 and 7 and 9 times tables. You can use pasta shells, buttons, ribbons, cotton wool, feathers - anything fun that you can get your hands on to help you show how these times tables are represented. Once you've made your arrays and increased your understanding, log in to TTRockstars to test yourself!	Create your own fact file on an animal of your choice. What information can you find using a non-fiction book or the internet? Try to include average weight and height, their diet, their habitat and maybe even their appearance.	Using card and paper, can you design a movable/pop up card/fun Christmas card to send to your loved one or even your class teacher. Remember to get it in the post before the Christmas deadline!
