Year 6 only	<p>For Year 6 children, we have photocopied past SATs papers for the following subjects:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maths - Paper 1 & 2 • English reading • Grammar and Punctuation. <p>Although we know the SATs have been cancelled, it is still important that the children maintain their skills and SATs practise covers all the learning from across the year.</p> <p>We have also given the children their login for SPAG.com where we have set up questions for the children to complete. https://www.spag.com/</p>
Reading	<p>https://ukhosted43.renlearn.co.uk/2252803 (accelerated reader quiz)</p> <p>Reading is key. Two 30 minutes sessions per day reading. One 30 minute session reading independently. One 30 minute session of book talk discussing what has happened so far. In this time the children could have a go at one or more of the following activities. During the course of a week we would expect the children to complete most of activities but they don't need to be formally recorded.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Predict what might happen in your story. • Write 5 questions you would like to ask one of the characters/author or you don't understand about the book. • Talk about how the book/character/events link to other books you have read. • Make a list of unfamiliar vocabulary in your reading book and find out what the words mean. • Summarise in 5/10/50 words what has happened in a page, chapter, section of your book. • Read a newspaper, magazine or information leaflet.
Mental Maths	<p>Times Tables Rock Stars 20 minutes per day. https://trockstars.com/ (play online with your friends)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make up a range of 3, 4 and 5 digit numbers and multiply/divide them by 10, 100 and 1000.
Maths	<p>Complete lesson 15 and the decimals chapter review from the workbook. The textbook pages are included to help if you get stuck. (Look at the attached files in the folder on the website)</p>
Writing	<p>Write a new chapter of Charlie and the chocolate factory. The children have already created a 6th golden ticket winner. We would like the children to write the part where the character has an unfortunate event in one of the rooms of the chocolate factory. Think carefully about the room and what it might be like and how you can describe the character through their speech and action.</p>
Topic work	<p>Geography. Find out about another country in South America. Write a fact file comparing it with the UK.</p>
Physical Activity	<p>Use a ball to do wall catches against an outside wall. Throw at different angles and move to catch the rebound. Remember to avoid windows!</p>
Life Skills	<p>Help make a meal with your family. Play a board game with your family. Remember to be a good winner or loser.</p>
