We have now taught and learned all of the times tables up to 12 x 12 and the expectation at this point is that they know their times tables off-by-heart. Please can we ask you to support them at home by identifying any tables which they don't know quite so well and practice these. TT rockstars will focus on the times tables that your child needs based on their interaction. Please encourage short periods of practice at least three times a week. This will be monitored and time in school will also be given. There is also a battle between both Year 4 classes every week. Every question counts!
