Your child can listen to the book on https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCOU6NS13kVz62deXq-o7duA under the playlist '13th July'. The Woodmice class will listen to the book in class and begin making their books and will take them home to complete as part of their home learning. The Dormice class will need to listen to the story, ask them the following questions: What can you see that is different about the crab and snail? How many feet does the snail have? How many feet does the crab have? 'How many feet do the children have? What is used to make 3? What do you notice about the odd numbers? We have attached pictures below to support your child when finishing their books as part of their home learning. The children only need to go up to 10, although some may want to challenge themselves to go up to 20. Can they use a combination of the pictures (or choose or draw their own) to create their own book. E.g., 3 is a flamingo and a snail, 4 is a camel, 5 is a camel
Writing	 and a snail etc. We are really enjoying looking at your child's weekend writes and seeing how they are progressing so would like to encourage them to keep this up. Can your child challenge themselves to write more than one sentences about their weekend this week? Can they start their sentence with a capital letter, use finger spaces in-between words and end with a full stop? As we are coming to the end of our time together in Foundation, we are beginning to think about transition to year 1. Can your child write a few facts about themselves to share with their next teacher? This could be their favourite thing to do at school, their favourite food, the names of their brothers and sisters or any pets etc.

The follow up activities will benefit all children even if they have done some of them in school as it will help consolidate their learning.
