<u>Kinesthetic</u> I enjoy doing hands on activities, sports and dance.	Find a picture of yourself as a baby and a toddler. Talk to your adult about the things you could do at that age. How have you changed as you've grown older?	Predict what you will look like as an adult. Draw yourself and write the things you think you'll be able to do.	Take part in your community (sports club, rainbows, church etc.). How did it make you feel to be part of the group?	Make a scene to show people in a community coming together. You could use lego, junk modelling, paint, Plasticine – anything you like.	Make up a song that celebrates people coming together. You might want to perform it or send a video to your teacher on teams.

To help children really enjoy our topics in school, and share with you their learning at home, our home learning is packed with a variety of fun and engaging activities for you to try at home. Please don't be overwhelmed by the quantity of ideas on the page.

Our expectations:

In line with our home learning policy, we still expect approximately one hour to be spent on home learning each week. This could be on one activity in depth, or multiple activities. We would still like the children to choose their learning, depending on which activities sound appealing to them. As a guide, we recommend focusing on one column each week e.g. KNOWING in week 1. Home learning books should be handed in by Wednesday each week and we will send them home again on a Friday.

In summary:

- 1 hour per week
- One column per week (choose between 1-3)
- Colour as you go (to show completion)
- Continue to read daily (at least 5 times per week)
