Maths	<p>Year 3 are moving on to Chapter 12 with Mr Poad, looking at angles. Year 4 will also be beginning a new chapter with Miss Bellis, on position and movement. Please email in learning from 1 session.</p>
Writing	We have a new story to look at for the new half term. We will begin by making predictions, making sure we use evidence to support our ideas. Then we will identify word classes before checking we have understood what we have read by sequencing the story.
Weekly Spellings	<p>Practice writing your spellings using the strategies you use in class. Then look, cover, write and check. A video summary of these spelling rules can be found on our YouTube channel. Year 3: press, suppress, express, compress, impress, prevent, invent, venture, adventure, eventful Year 4: calendar, grammar, regular, particular, peculiar, popular, consider, remember, quarter, integer You can use a dictionary or www.dictionary.com to help you understand their meanings.</p>
